

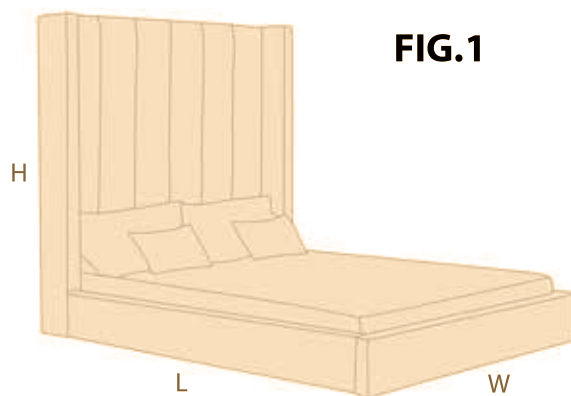
So, you've found the furniture of your dreams but unsure it'll fit?

This is where our guide comes in! Measure up and see if your staircase, doorways and/or passages are wide enough for delivery.

1. MEASURING YOUR BED

The base of your bed will arrive in multiple boxes, so usually getting these into your room of choice isn't an issue. However, our headboards are one piece and depending on the bed ordered, they can be quite large. We'll only need the headboard dimensions for this guide. Measurements can be found on the website under the item's 'dimensions' tab: **Width** and **Height**. To be extra safe and reduce the risk of damage, our beds are delivered in their packaging so please add 2-3mm to account for this. Firstly make a note of your dimensions below.

2a. THROUGH THE DOOR

Secondly, we'll need to ensure that your headboard will fit through the front door. Measure the width of your door entry (**A**) (**FIG.2**).

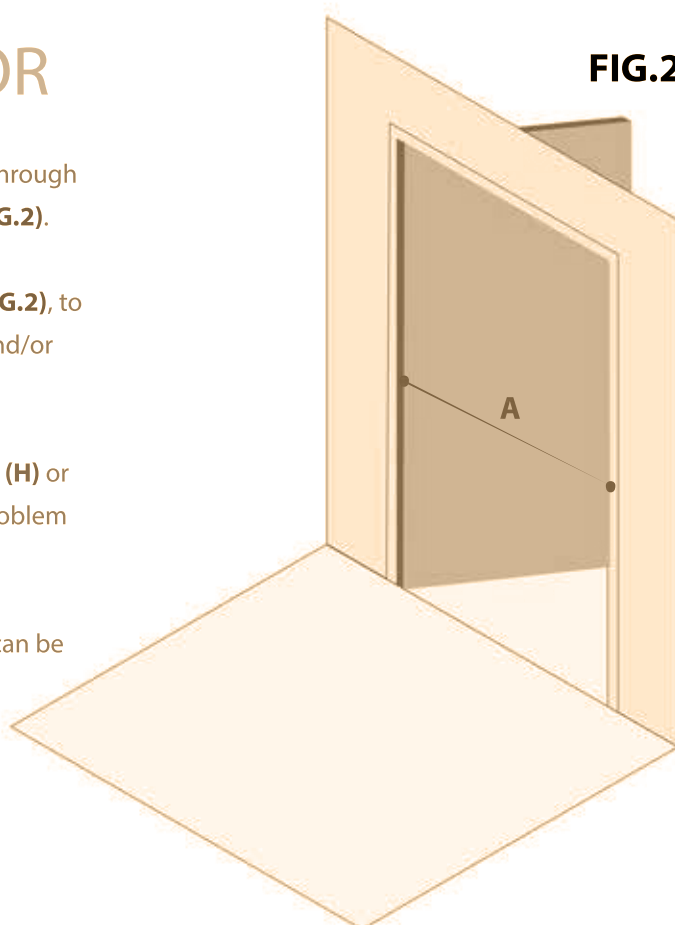
NB: Measure from the **door edge** to the **frame edge (A)** (**FIG.2**), to get the true width. Please take into account door handles and/or any other objects which could obstruct delivery.

If (**A**) measurement is greater than your headboard's **height (H)** or **width (W)** then our White Glove service shouldn't have a problem getting your item into your property.

NB: There should be no obstructions behind the door so it can be opened fully.

Is the width of (**A**) smaller than your bed's **height (H)**?

If so, not to worry! We have a plan B..



2b. Plan B

If plan A didn't quite work out, we have a Plan B.

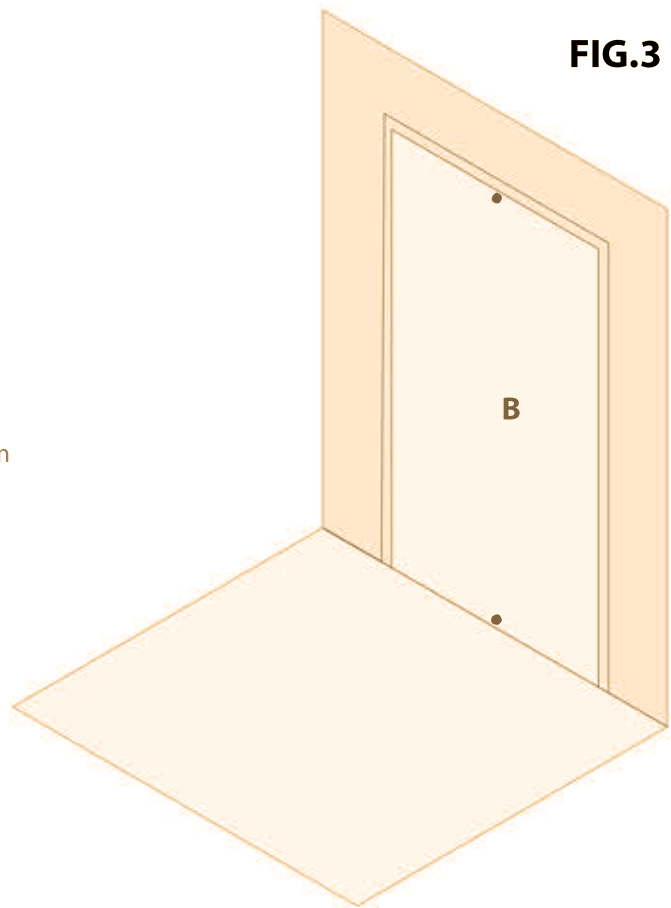
Measure the height of your door frame and make a note of it:

B:

Is **(B)** taller than your headboard's **height (H)** or **width (W)**? If yes, then your bed should fit providing you have enough room in your hallway to move it into.

Did Plan B not work out for you either? If you have another entry into your property, please try this.

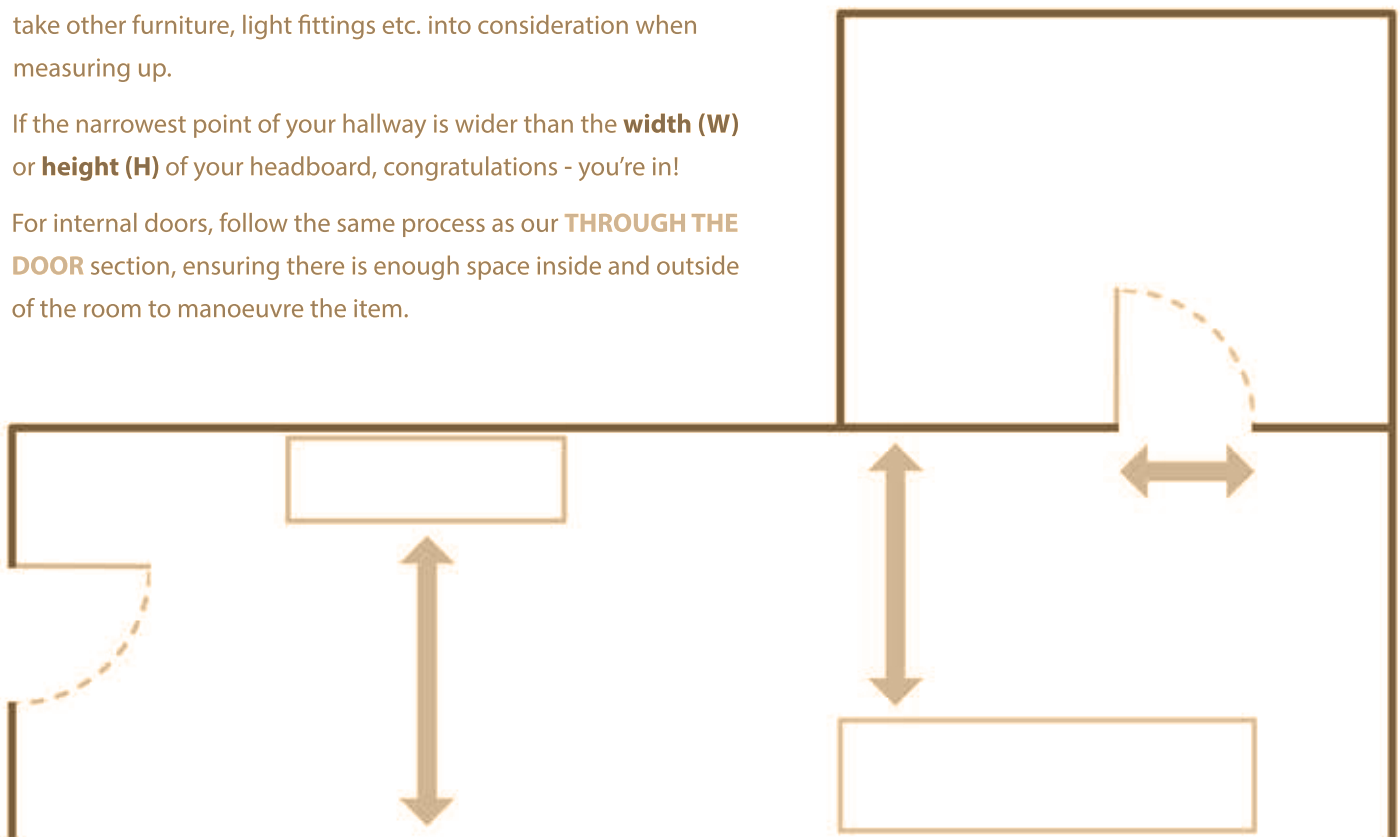


3. Hallway & Internal Doors

Start by measuring your hallway as its narrowest point, ensure to take other furniture, light fittings etc. into consideration when measuring up.

If the narrowest point of your hallway is wider than the **width (W)** or **height (H)** of your headboard, congratulations - you're in!

For internal doors, follow the same process as our **THROUGH THE DOOR** section, ensuring there is enough space inside and outside of the room to manoeuvre the item.



4. Up The Stairs

Measure the width of your stairs at its narrowest point and note it here (take into account handrails etc.) :

C:

Is (C) wider than the **width (W)** of your bed? If so, it should fit.

Do you have a landing? If yes, we'll need to take a few more measurements to ensure your headboard will go up the stairs.

Measure the width (C), depth (E) and height (F) of your landing (see FIG.5). You should be fine if the measurements are all larger than the **width (W)**, width again (W) and **height (H)** of your new headboard.

To be extra cautious measure (G.a) (if you have a bannister) or (G.b) (if you have a wall), these measurements should be larger than the **height (H)** or **width (W)** of your headboard.

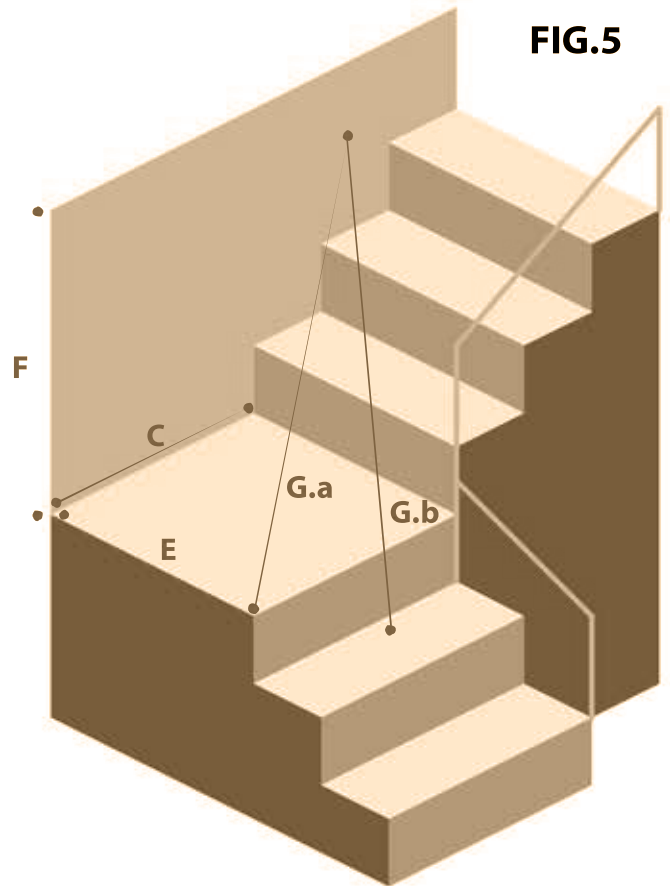
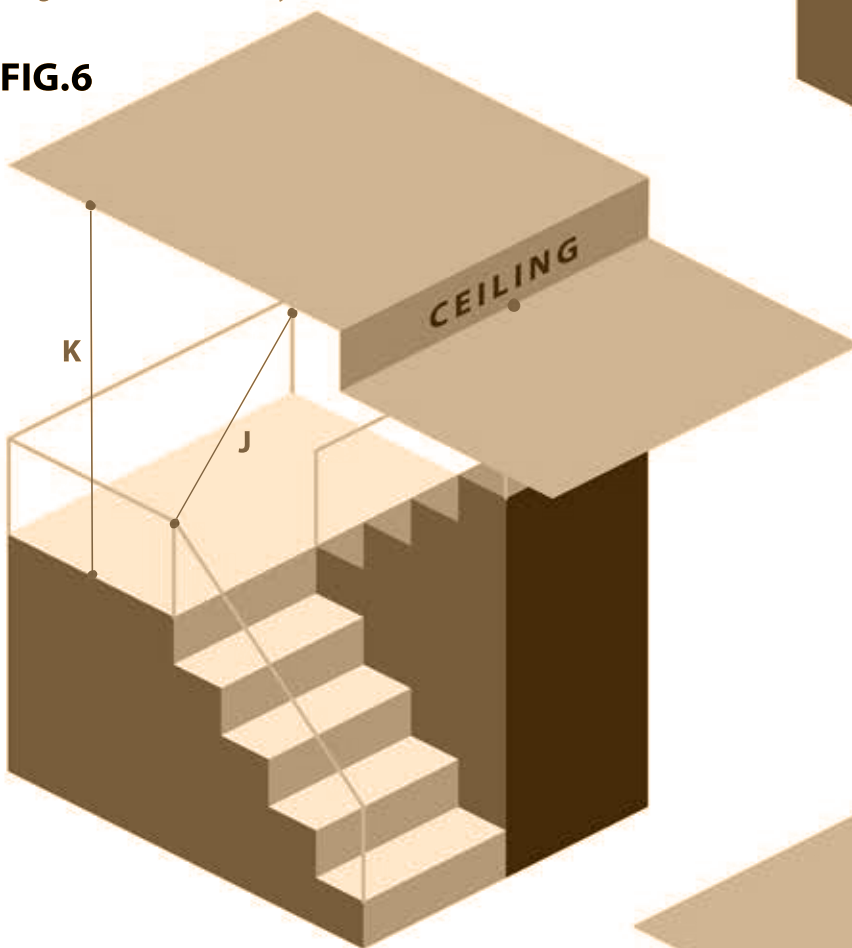
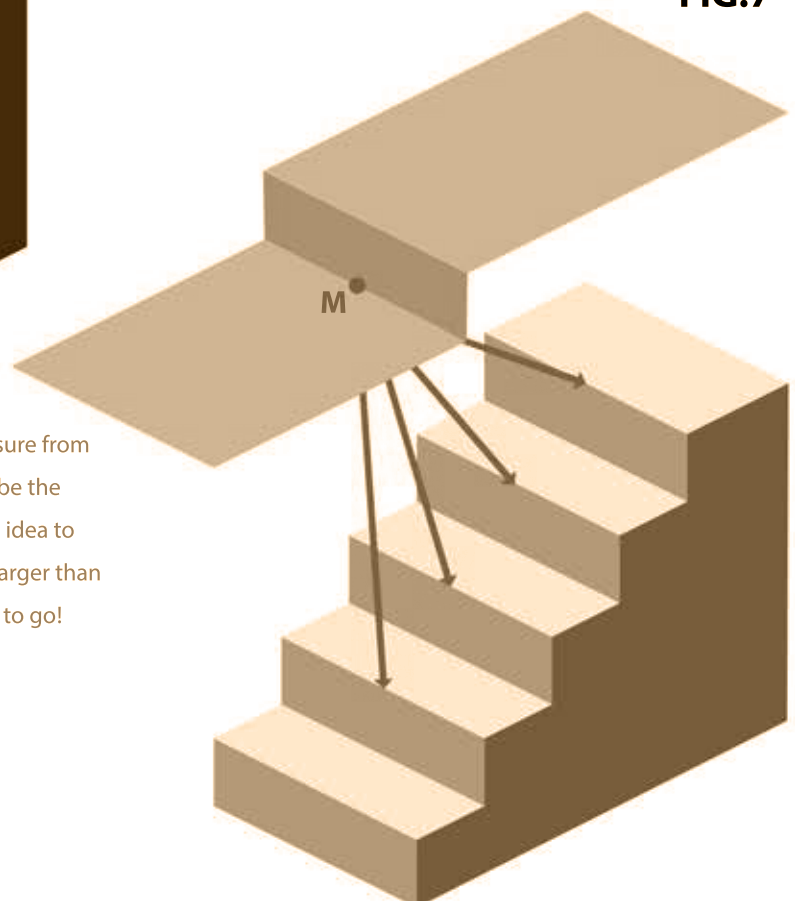

For properties with high rise stairs you'll need to take a couple of measurements to ensure your stairs are wide enough for delivery. Measure (K) and (J), these measurements should be larger than the **height (H)** of your headboard and the **width (W)** respectively.

To ensure you have enough space to get up the stairs please measure from a single point (M) to the edge of your step. The single point must be the shortest distance from your ceiling to the step edge, so it's a good idea to take a few measurements (FIG.7). This measurement (M) must be larger than the **height (H)** or **width (W)** of your headboard. If so, you're good to go!
